Around Kentucky, a fascinating world often misunderstood by many unfoldsthe world of snakes. Despite their infamous reputation, these creatures are far more complex and essential to the state's ecosystem than meets the eve. More than 30 snake species live in Kentucky, but only four possess venom, while the rest contribute to the intricate balance of nature. Kentucky's diverse landscapes provide an ideal habitat for these oftenmaligned creatures. The venomous snakes, ranging from the secretive copperhead and Western cottonmouth, aka water moccasin, to the pygmy rattlesnake and the graceful timber rattlesnake, are vital to the state's environment. They often go unnoticed, keeping populations of mice and other rodents in check. Numerous non-venomous snakes such as the common garter snake and the North American black racer thrive throughout the state. The University of Kentucky Martin-Gatton College of Agriculture, Food and Environment offers a comprehensive website to help you identify and learn more about snakes vou may encounter around your home or farm. A user-friendly interface allows you to pinpoint snake species based on its geographic location and unique characteristics. A snake's head shape, body structure or color patterns all offer clues to help with identification. Whether you find a snake while hiking through the woods or exploring your own backyard, this platform will help you fight fear with information. Photographs and descriptions offer a visual encyclopedia for both venomous and non-venomous species in the region. If you come in close contact with a venomous snake, use caution and respect. You may learn to appreciate them from a safe distance and admire them in their natural habitats.



1¼ cups whole-wheat flour

1¼ teaspoons baking soda

11/2 teaspoons ground

1/2 teaspoon salt

cinnamon

Buying Kentucky Proud is easy. Look for the label at your grocery store, farmers' market, or roadside stand.

Preheat oven to 325 degrees F. In a large bowl, combine flours, baking soda, salt and spices. In a small bowl, combine honey, eggs, pumpkin and oil; stir into dry ingredients just until moistened. Fold in apples. Fill greased or paper lined muffin cups, two-thirds full. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes or until muffins

Note: Can substitute two cups granulated sugar for honey, decrease baking soda by ¼ teaspoon and increase oven temperature to 350 degrees F.

Yield: 18 muffins
